1. Home and Family is open to **ALL** youth up to 18 years or Grade 12. No previous experience in entering fairs is required.
2. No pre-entry is required. Exhibits will be accepted for judging **Tuesday, May 2nd**, from **4 p.m. to 8 p.m.** in the 4-H Building.
3. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED BEFORE OR AFTER THIS DATE. PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THEM TO THE FAIR OFFICE.**
4. There is an entry fee of \$.50 for each entry.
5. **One entry form per Section**
6. No duplicate recipes from the same family
7. Each exhibit should have an entry tag attached with name, address, and telephone number of exhibitor prior to entering. **PLEASE PRINT.** No more than two exhibitors per entry. **Entry tags are available online at www.SpringYouthFair.org.**
8. Place ribbons will be presented to all participants. Champion and Reserve ribbons will be given at the discretion of the judge.
9. Section VI, Class 1 posters are limited to 2 ft. x 3 ft.
10. The 4-H Building will be closed Sunday from 4 - 5 p.m. to take down displays.
11. **Please arrange to have exhibits picked up between 5 - 6 p.m. Sunday, May 7th. There will be NO Monday pickup.**
11. To promote clothing exhibits and demonstrations, the entries in Section II, Class 1, Lots 1-5 will receive additional premiums.

CLASS 1 EXHIBITS

All exhibits should be on a paper plate & include a recipe card.

Food exhibits need the following to display:

4 items for small exhibits such as cookies or candy

$\frac{1}{2}$ of a loaf of bread.

$\frac{1}{4}$ of a cake, or a full cake if decorated.

Decorated cakes (Lot 3) are judged on the quality of decorations and are not cut or tasted.

$\frac{1}{4}$ of a pie or a whole pie in a small pan.

No refrigerated products will be accepted including cream cheese items.

***TABLE SETTING SPECIAL RULES:**

1. \$.50 entry fee
2. Only non-perishable fruits and vegetables allowed on table.
3. No purchased paper plates, cups or disposable plastic flatware.
4. Linen, china, glassware, flatware and other accessories should be marked with name of owner, but marking must not show when placed on the table. Reasonable precaution will be taken to insure safety of exhibits, but the Spring Youth Fair does not assume any responsibility for loss or damage.
