RULES, please read for changes

What is Spring Youth Fair about? It's easy really. Spring Youth Fair is designed for today's youth to learn something new, to stretch their thinking, and to make friends with others who have the same interests. Your child must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times, not dropped off and left. There will be other exhibits and species on display of which kids and adults can enter in as well.

You **MUST** bring your own cage that your rabbit/cavy can be displayed in safely for the entire weekend. No boxes, no large dog cages. Solid wire bottom cages are required. Spill proof food and water containers are required, and will not be provided. Any food and water must be in storage in a tidy manner in a small tack room in barn. You alone are responsible for keeping your area clean for the public to walk around. We may be showing, but we are a public display. This includes sweeping your area and cleaning up after your animals, there will be no herdsmanship shifts, but exhibitors we welcome to participate. Remember to wear pants, a long sleeved shirt and closed toed shoes for your own safety while handling animals. Our barn will not be heated, if the weekend is hot you are welcome to bring a fan.

RABBIT & CAVY BENCHING – NEW.... While we have activities all weekend, rabbits will not be spending the night. Because this is a carrying cage show, we don't want the rabbits to be locked up in tiny spaces all weekend. The barn will be open at 9am on Saturday and Sunday, animals must be in the barn by 10am. Animals will be released at 7pm Saturday and 5pm Sunday.

Attendance...while we encourage everyone to attend all weekend, we understand that maybe you can only attend one day, or only interested in certain clinics. Unless otherwise mentioned to the superintendent, it will be assumed you will attend all weekend.

To help save space, please do not bring any saw horse table racks, or tables unless otherwise given permission. Grooming table tops or carpets are allowed, but only if it is able to rest on top of a cage.

Demonstrations... There will be an opportunity for the exhibitors to sign-up for a demonstration slot. This will not be a premium or ribbon contest, but a time to practice with a crowd. These slots will be 20minutes each, and must be rabbit or cavy related and family friendly. Sign-ups are first come first serve on Friday during set-up. All subject to change.

Advertising animals for sale during fair is not allowed.

Rabbits and Cavies will be on exhibition only and not judged for type. If you would like one of our senior teen exhibitors to go over your animal's qualities with you, there will be a sign up sheet at check in. We will fit this in as time allows.

** Type Judging may be added next year depending on this year's turn out and added interest.

If you are unable to bring an animal you still may participate in the clinics and classes.... we might have a critter we can share.... or you can bring a stuffed toy, just let us know.

The Southwest Washington Fairgrounds, Spring Youth Fair and superintendents are not responsible for any lost or stolen items.

Our weekend will be filled with Clinics and Contests for Fitting & Showing as well as information packed games. At the end of our weekend we will end with an awards ceremony. No type judging will be done this year. It is designed to be a low key, fun weekend while learning!
